

What happens at Relay?



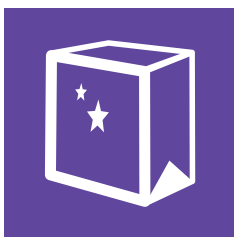
Relay participants are welcomed in the opening ceremony



The first lap of Relay honours cancer Survivors and Carers who take to the track and are acknowledged and supported by all



With motivation levels high, teams pour onto the track & all participants walk the second lap together



Darkness is symbolic of the fear that a patient feels when diagnosed. After sunset, we light candlebags to remember those we have lost, celebrate cancer survivors and to show those affected by cancer that they are not alone



Team members take turns walking throughout the event to symbolise the ongoing fight against cancer



When not walking, participants enjoy the Relay atmosphere and festivities, visiting team campsites to participate in games, activities and entertainment



Closing Ceremonies wrap up the event, where we recognise volunteers and the community and say **THANK YOU** to everyone who makes Relay possible
